Salutations!

My name is Tyler Adamthwaite and I have been working with BSW since August. I am originally from Denver, where I began playing violin in my school's fifth grade band and orchestra program. I have always felt a knack for improvising and composing and decided to pursue writing music as a career. I hold a Bachelor of Music in Music Composition from Colorado State University and a Master of Fine Arts in Music Composition from Brandeis University. This semester I am also finishing my PhD in Music Composition from the University at Buffalo.

My primary role at BSW is as a Teaching Artist, working with the kids at our Niagara Street site to provide them with a holistic music education through **promoting their leadership and creativity**. In addition to this, I also transcribe songs and compose original pieces for BSW. In the future, I would like to use my skills for BSW and other nonprofit music organizations to curate pieces which reflect the cultures that they serve.

In June of 2023 you will have the chance to hear the beginning of what I hope to be a longterm project called **The Great Sharing**. This project is a massive collaborative effort among the BSW staff and families to collect songs from our community and translate them to classical string instruments. It is very important to us because this process allows our students to see their own **cultures reflected in the music they are playing** in addition to the usual pieces young musicians learn, like those by Bach and Mozart.

This school year we collected a few songs from our parents, which I transcribed for string instruments. Then I used the melodies to create an entirely new composition for the entire student body, from all levels of BSW, to play together. It is my hope that this will foster the feeling of community, leadership, and musicianship that we promote to our students by showing off everything that music can bring to a gathering of people.
